This fee includes:

- 25 hours per week tuition
- Accommodation with carefully selected homestay accommodation on a half-board basis. Residential accommodation is available at the University of East Anglia from June to September.

- Free Internet access and use of computer centre
- Social programme – comprising evening activities and weekend excursions to places of interest e.g. Cambridge and the Norfolk Coast

Accommodation in Norwich

Homestay accommodation is provided in single study-bedrooms with carefully selected hosts. It comprises bed, breakfast & evening meal each day and light lunch (or packed lunch as appropriate) at weekends.

Residential accommodation (when available) is provided in self-catering accommodation comprising single study-bedrooms with private bathroom. There is a fully-equipped, shared kitchen/dining room.

Half-board and full board residential accommodation is also available.
